



## CONSTRUCTION PROJECT INFORMATION FLYER CITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE

### Charlotte Street Roadway and Utility Improvements

**Project Goal:** The Charlotte Street Roadway and Utility Improvements project will improve the brick roadway, potable water distribution and service, gravity sanitary sewer collection and transmission, and stormwater collection. The project limits are Charlotte Street between King Street and Bridge Street.

#### Project Improvements

G&H Underground Construction, Inc. will furnish, install, and perform the following work:

- Remove and place-out-of-service cast iron (CI) potable water main
- Install 4, 6, and 8-inch diameter PVC potable water main
- Remove vitrified clay pipe (VCP) gravity sanitary sewer
- Install PVC gravity sanitary sewer mains
- Remove and replace gravity sanitary sewer manholes
- Remove and place-out-of-service wastewater force main
- Remove and stockpile existing brick
- Improve roadway profile
- Install concrete base and new brick road

Customers system wide will benefit from improved water quality and service. At least two dozen customers adjacent to the construction will benefit locally from this project.

**Project Overview:** During the construction phase, the contractor will make every effort to provide access to resident's entrances to driveways, subdivisions and businesses during the day. There may be times when driveways or entrances may be inaccessible, but our intent is to minimize any inconveniences to the local residents and businesses during this project phase, and we ask for your patience as this project progresses. At the end of each weekday, the excavation areas will be backfilled and compacted; and all residential and business driveways should be accessible. The contractor will be videotaping the entire project area prior to starting the construction to verify the existing conditions. The contractor may also be contacting property owners to identify any irrigation systems located within the construction areas. Any damage caused by construction will be repaired by the contractor at no cost to the owner.
