At RB Hunt school. So if I'm coming from the South, those are great options. I can still drive around if I want to.

He's our mobility coordinator. We're talking about parking specifically, started off talking about 4th of July, but I do want to switch gears haha.

In general, we started a star circulator. Tell us about that. That's it. I love the star circulator, and I'm going to give it a bigger plug here in a second about concerts. But tell us about the star.

Yes, we have.

Circulator so we started the star circulator last summer, and we're shuttling on an average about 3000 people in a month, so it it's people are using it.

And it runs from the Vic.

It stops in two locations before it circles back to the Vic. The first stop is in front.

Fort and then it it circles around and it stops on cathedral placed by the Bank of America. The Old Bank of America building. And then it goes back to the IC. It runs from 10:00 PM to 10:00 AM to 10:00 PM.

So all day. So I'm going to this is where I'm.

Seven days a week.

This is where I'm going to give the plug for concerts in the Plaza, because that's a big summertime activity that we host.

Every Thursday night, and we were we've been promoting also with parking as the Park St. Aug resident discount, Saint Johns County discount \$3 yes. Have you been having to deal?

With that, not not so much. That's pretty much terrorism. Megan Lee.

Not not so much. That's Tara. So if I get my \$3 entrance admission cost for and I'm a resident, I can drive to this parking garage, park my car, hop on that star circulator because, like, you were just talking about, it's hot right now. So I don't necessarily want to have to lug.

But I can hop on that star circulator. It's going to drop me off at Cathedral, walk across the street, listen to the concert. Concerts are.

And the shuttle runs till 10, so I got plenty of time to hop back on that and get back to.

My car. Yeah. So to get your discount, you want to go to parksaintaug.com?

And you want to fill out the application you want to get a copy of your driver's license and your registration so you can attach it in the boxes when you're filling out the application, and then they will approve you. It takes a little time to get approved. They've only got two people working on this, and sometimes they're about 500 requests.

Deep and they will approve you when you get your e-mail and then you can get \$3.00 an hour or \$3 per visit in the garage and it's \$0.50 an hour on the.

Street with your discount as well. So the discount also applies on to on street parking. And I just said I thought I'm going to have to circle back.

Reader yeah, there is a there's a license plate reader and then the the, the, the worker inside the the box moved that we'll see that come up on their screen and it identifies them as a as a resident Parker and it gives them the discount and they charge you \$3 you can either pay.

And then during December, that's where we kind of change it up and we're not shuttling from the island, but light up night.

We we only use the island on light up night and we have permission to use the Anastasia Baptist Church. We can use the amp if there's not an event. The last two years there was a concert and a private outing, so we were unable to use that lot that night we did. We were allowed to use our behind. We do not use the Alligator Farm on light up night.
