He is the short term rental supervisor. The code enforcement manager, homelessness liaison, among other things. Barry, welcome.

We're really kind of working in towards, you know, the unlicensed contractors and the homeowners doing work without permits. And then we're really supporting the historic function, OK. And and that right now entails me going back and doing an assessment.

Of about 600 homes that we had on these damage assessment lists and.

My mom was.

Complete with that now and the good news is, is now that ties into short term rentals because the good news is, is that.

The short term rental would be economy and the short term rental.

Aspect of our economy really kind of caused the renovation of a lot of these homes that were on these damaged lists. These categories doing category four homes that we were, you know, kind of paying attention to or or someone had made this list of them. So it caused them to be renovated or brought into compliance. So I'm I'm finding that a lot of the homes of the 600.

I mean, we may really want some done with it. We may really be looking.

About, you know, 25% of that list is something still needs to be addressed. So you know the economy, short term rentals and things like that is really kind of pushed the the renovation and the and the compliance of those.

Homes. The short term rentals. Do you? What do you what do you find? I know a lot of what you do. And what?

Morgan does is the inspections making sure that everybody's registered? What are the other things you do respond to a lot or are you more you feel like you're proactive or reactive on the short?

Yes, so we try.

Term rental slide.

To be proactive on the things that we can and then of course we're completely reactive in reference to bad actors in the neighborhoods. You know, the residents know they can call a number. One of the things that sticklers is trash cans for short term rentals and parking for short term rentals. And those things are really can't be. They're not easily solved.

Yeah, the parking is sticky.

The Parkings will sticky and it and.

And for good reason. It's confusing to the public and the and the and the people out there. And so, you know, we have to kind of work through those things individually.

The problem with the parking is that if cars are if cars are legally parked.

On the street, you can't go and look and say, are you a resident or are you just here with that short term rental across the street?

The the ordinance says that you have to provide parking on site. It doesn't say that the parking.

Has to be used to use that.

Unfortunately, that's because.

It's American. It's a public street, right. And people have the right now, unless you know you're violating some sort of a residential neighborhood parking issue or no parking or yellow curb or something like that. I mean, those rules still exist, but, you know, we're still in America and that's, you know, that's still legal.

It's looking less so, but I don't know what that translates to and where are we on our.

We had a the the family reunification program, the the one that started under 2003, 2004, under Steve Fricky, that's been tweaked a little bit.

Little easier to get to. So that's given the law enforcement, the ability to move more people.

That's putting them on a bus and sending them out of out of Saint Augustine.

Somewhere. Yeah. And you know, and we have a new homeless outreach officer that works for me now. Not the Police Department. She provides support in the form of transportation stuff for the Police Department. So we don't take police officers off.

Street. And then when she's not doing that, she does a lot of walking around and meeting with people and a lot of referring to the different.

Recreate the services that are already being offered and the that's not what we want to do as a city or as government, and that's not what I don't think our citizens want us pushing money to recreate.

We we as a city don't want to be creating services that we know are already being provided.

Yeah, already being provided for and already being funded by government and there there are a huge amount of organizations doing that. And if you don't know, just go to the continuum of care and you can look at the umbrella organization and see all the organizations up underneath that continuum of care. So.

We have a lot of organizations in the community.

That's what Jessica's been doing. She's really been making a lot of contacts, moving a lot of people around. She's helping them as much as getting them over to Social Security or to the, you know, wherever they need to go to get services provided to them. And and then we've been concentrating on the drop in center.

Mr. Franklin and I recently met with the continuum of care and we are in the process of setting up some dates so we can have some open houses for the service providers for phase two. So phase one will be the.

Tanning. Tanning with the OK.

Dining, dining, pavilion, and we'll call it dining with pavilion because we'll, we'll say, dining with dignity is moving there. But dining with dignity may change hands. Or, you know, another organization may come and you know. So we're going to say it's. Yeah, the dining pavilion. The showers will be.

Oh, I like that dining pavilion.

In it and the dining pavilion, if folks are folks, aren't sure what we're talking about.

A year ago or more, this is this conversation has been going on, but they're behind the wind, Dixie on 207 and S Dixie Highway. If you drive by there, there was the old furniture store was there on the corner. And that's going to be the center. And then if you drive by there now, you see the fence behind that fence is where this.

207 S sexy yeah.

Dining pavilion and some will call them amenities but yeah, so continue. I just wanted folks.

Vegan will be.

Yes. So we're talking about the dining pavilion is out forbid now and when it's built, it'll have an under roof dining area where dining with dignity can start serving dinner.

To know what?

There it will also have a water fountain. It will have fans.

But it additionally, we'll have showers and it will have the ability to have washers and dryers there. So ultimately what we what we want to provide is dining a facility for the individuals wanting to serve food to the homeless and then we are going to provide showers.

And then we're going to create a post office there because the post office is key because if they can get mail at a physical address then they can start receiving benefits that they're entitled to. Benefits won't get mailed to general delivery, and that's how that's. So if they're, if they're.

It's things like getting an ID card.

Yeah, absolutely. Yeah. So we got to create that. You know that process for the mail and I got some good ideas from an organization down out of Orlando.

Getting your.

And and we'll, we'll get that. That'll be hammered out real quick, but the the open house kind of town hall meetings that we're going to have with the service providers and continuum of care first will be strictly concentrated on phase two. And phase two will be the development of a much larger facility.

That will include.

Space for service providers to be in now. We're not going to house an individual service provider, we're going to supply an, you know, an office for, right? Yeah.

It's fake, like a Co-op. Almost.

Like a Co-op for.

Providers.

Right now, one or two service providers may take up a full time resident seeing it because it's important.

We plan on having an area that's big enough for a neighborhood meeting room in it that can also double as because we'll be out of the flood area, flood zone at that point and we can be on generated power for need be. So we want to.

Build an area big enough to wear possibly.

It can be considered right to look at the ability for an evacuation, kind of a homeless shelter in the form of that, because now they got to go to it. They go to schools and there's there's problems riddled with that, yeah.

In evacuation space.

And that's it. That is that going to be in that building, we think we're going to be able to renovate.

No. So nothing will be in the blue building because the blue building doesn't meet. We would have to put so much money into the blue build.

That we would eclipse that 50% and that would cause us to have to bring it up the to the base flood elevation. Just gonna ultimately probably the blue building comes down OK. Unless we can find a different use other than offices or habitation for it like think storage or something like that. But other than that you know the blue building ultimately will probably come down.

The tree canopy is beautiful and it's it's like 20° cooler up underneath it than it is in sun, and we plan on opening it up so that earlier so that people can come and just stay. There will be security there and they will be able to come. We will probably be looking at putting in some leads.
